Guidelines for Interacting Online

Participant Guidelines

- Students are required to use their real names when logging onto academy learning platforms. Nicknames, acronyms, or phone numbers are not permitted.
- When using videoconferencing apps, be aware of your background surroundings and personal attire.
- Restrict discussion to curriculum or activity; no discussion of personal issues, sexual conversations or pornography will be permitted.
- No drugs or alcohol.
- No screenshots, images, and/or videos of class sessions, instructors, or peers may be posted to the web or social media.

Parents and students should be aware of the following guidelines that will be followed by program staff:

- 1. Two or more program staff will be present in all online interactions with students.
- 2. Program staff will always use proper TKC credentials, such as logging in with your network ID in TKC licensed Zoom, MS Teams or other program platforms.

Program staff will avoid using personal social media platforms.

'Friending' youth on social media is prohibited.

There is zero tolerance for cyber bullying or harassment from staff or participants.



Dress Code

We are requiring all participants to wear white dresses to both our orientation and graduation ceremonies.

In order to maintain the safety and professionalism of our online environment, students are asked to abide by the following guidelines. Clothing should not distract participants from learning. The following dress code applies at all times during online interaction:

No tank tops, halter tops, low cut tops, tube tops, spaghetti straps, or muscle shirts.

No bare midriffs.

No clothing or accessories with crude or suggestive slogans, references and/or pictures.

No sleeping attire (pajamas, bonnets, wave caps, etc.)

No gang paraphernalia.

If inappropriate attire or paraphernelia is observed, students may be asked to change in order to continue participation.

All sessions will be recorded.



General Expectations

EmpowHER: Empowering Black Girls to Lead is a simulation of the Beloved Community experience. Students are asked to challenge themselves both personally and academically while adhering to and supporting the program rules and philosophy as described below:

Students are expected to attend all classes on time and be prepared with the appropriate materials. Log in to the virtual Zoom room 5-10 minutes before class begins or arrive at the King Center (449 Auburn Ave NE Atlanta GA 30312)

EmpowHER: Empowering Black Girls to Lead asks that students pay close attention to their physical health and well-being during the program.

Be aware of individual safety and the safety of others at all times, especially during physical activities.

Get enough rest each night to assure positive participation in classes.

Students are expected to participate as positive and helpful group members by:

Assisting with group work

Respecting others.

Following the directives of all staff members.

Students are asked to abide by all The King Center's Guidelines and Policies. Students who violate any policy may be asked to leave the program.
